## Parents Leaflet (0-7 years)

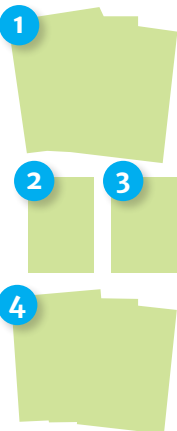
This new leaflet has advice for parents on safe forms of transport and how to teach their children about road safety.

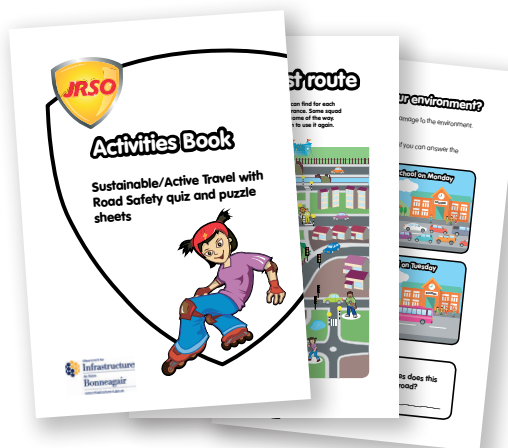
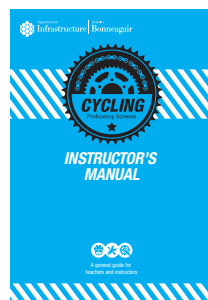

# Sustainable & Active Travel Toolkit

Sustainable and active travel is making travel decisions that reduce the impact on the environment such as walking, cycling, using public transport, car sharing, Park & Ride / Stride. It also involves encouraging and increasing the amount of physical activity we do for part or all of our journeys.



## Cycling Proficiency Scheme (CPS)

CPS teaches children how to ride their bicycles safely. The scheme is a mixture of theory and practical experience.



## Practical Child Pedestrian Safety Training

This training is offered to selected primary schools in socially deprived areas. The scheme targets children in primary years 3, 4 and 5 and aims to develop their pedestrian skills, identify dangers and provide practice in crossing roads through supervised walks.



## Junior Road Safety Officers (JRSO)

A relevant and proactive scheme introduced to Northern Ireland in 2013. The aim is to give children the ability to bring road safety and active/sustainable travel issues to the attention of their school and wider community. There is a JRSO workbook full of activities that will help the JRSO spread the road safety message.



## Active School Travel Programme

This programme is co-funded by the Department for Infrastructure and Public Health Agency Northern Ireland, and is delivered by Sustrans NI. The programme runs for 3 years and it aims to encourage pupils to choose a more active and sustainable means of travel.



## Public Transport

As part of the Programme for Government, we are all being encouraged to use buses and trains more often. Promotion and Outreach Branch have developed presentations and a leaflet for primary schools. There is also a presentation to assist year 7 pupils in the transition to post-primary education.



## School Active and Sustainable Travel Policy

Every school should have a policy which clearly indicates what they are doing in respect of active and sustainable travel. The policy will provide information on how the school delivers safe and sustainable travel education to the pupils in its care.
