We would like the children to wear something Christmassy on this day, if they wish, but please do not go to the expense of buying a Christmas jumper!




It is essential to ensure that Supporting documentation (Birth Certificate) is with the school before the portal closes. If you need any additional help, please do not hesitate to contact the office.

# Cash for Clobber Collection

In perfect time for a Christmas clear out, we are participating in a clothes recycling programme called Cash for Clobber in conjunction with Cookstown Textile Recyclers.

The Eco-Warriors are asking for all used and unwanted clothes in bags, to be left into the school on or before Friday 20th January. These quality reusable items are exported to developing countries, including sub-Saharan Africa and Pakistan. It is also a great way to raise money for our school as we receive money linked directly to the weight of clothes we collect.

As well as clothes, we can also accept shoes (pairs only), handbags and belts. Duvets and pillows cannot be reused for hygiene reasons.
